Services for Australian Rural and Remote Allied Health (SARRAH) welcomes the opportunity to provide comments on the above mentioned accreditation arrangements and they follow:

Professional Body Representatives

Must have an understanding of the current and be able to anticipate future educational requirements of the sector.

Clinical Representatives

Must have at least 5 years practical experience

Must have experience in the development and/or delivery of education and training programmes

Must have an awareness of national/state/rural and remote issues

Must be up to date with current professional body policies relevant to radiography practice.

Academic Representatives

Must have education to the masters level.

Must be able to understand current education policies and practice

Must have an awareness of state/national/rural and remote issues

Must understand current professional body policies relevant to radiography practice.

Other Comments

Must be a member of a Professional Body and registered with AHPRA

Must agree to work within prescribe guidelines

Must be provided with appropriate access to training programmes

Must review the register every 2-3 years

Must ensure that the differing ATAR score requirements across the Australian universities is resolved to ensure future development is consistent across the profession.

In conclusion, we strongly recommend that a SARRAH representative is included onto the Committee to represent the particular needs of rural and remote practitioners.
